	<ul> <li>Athlete Recognition: Amy expressed pride in the athletes' commitment, dedication, and determination.</li> <li>Club Success: She highlighted this as the best year since before Covid across High Performance (HP), Competitive, and Pre-Competitive levels.</li> <li>Competition Participation: All teams attended 3-7 competitions between January and May.</li> <li>Membership Growth: Nearly 200 members with 80+ Recreational, 35 Pre-Competitive, 43 Competitive, and 25 High Performance athletes.</li> <li>Leadership Team: Amy noted it is the third year of the Leadership team: Steph (HP Lead), Amy (Comp Lead), and Vanessa (PC + Rec Lead), delivering programming across the entire club.</li> <li>Achievements: Numerous podium finishes, teams in finals, and personal bests.</li> </ul>		
	Future Plans: Focus on 2024 Summer programs and the 2024/25 season, with registration opening on July 1st.  TeamSnap Changes (Amy's Update):		
	<ul> <li>Registration: Opens July 1st to accommodate changes to the new business platform.</li> <li>Early Bird Pricing: Available until July 15, 2024. After July 16, HP and Competitive registration fees increase by \$100.</li> <li>Installments: If registered in July, payments start August 1st and run until April 1, 2025 (9 installments).</li> <li>Payment Options: HP &amp; Competitive can pay program fees in full for a 5% credit towards PFC. Instructions will be emailed in July; e-transfer deadline is August 1, 2024.</li> <li>Documentation: Handbooks and fees document will be circulated by June 24, 2024. Members are strongly encouraged to read these documents.</li> </ul>
